Impact on COD Processing July 24-25, 2010 (07/16/10)

Federal Student Aid is planning several system maintenance activities during the period July 24-25, 2010. In addition, the Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) will be unavailable from 3:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M. (ET) on July 25, 2010 due to its regular Sunday morning maintenance. These activities will result in outages of certain COD System functionality for a period of time.

An explanation of how these activities will impact COD System availability and processing follows below. Please review this information to determine if processing at your school will be affected.

Routine COD System Maintenance

Federal Student Aid will perform system maintenance on the COD System. The impact to COD users is outlined below. *Between 6:00 A.M. (ET) on Saturday, July 24, 2010 and 2:00 P.M. (ET) on Sunday, July 25, 2010* –

- Users will not be able to submit or retrieve data via the COD Web site.
- Users will not be able to access the COD Reports area of the COD Web site.
- An individual will not be able to complete online Direct Loan Entrance Counseling, complete a new Master Promissory Note (MPN) electronically, complete a Direct PLUS Loan Request electronically, or endorse a Direct PLUS Loan electronically via the StudentLoans.gov Web site.
- An individual will not be able to complete TEACH Grant Initial and Subsequent Counseling, complete a new TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS), or retrieve an existing ATS via the <u>TEACH Grant Web site</u>.
- Batches submitted by schools via the SAIG will be held or schools will receive an error
 message informing them that the SAIG is unavailable and that the data must be
 transmitted at a later time.

Electronic Announcement Posted – Notice of Proposed Rulemaking for Foreign Institutions (07/16/2010)

In a July 15, 2010 Electronic Announcement on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site, Federal Student Aid announced the submission of a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) for publication in the Federal Register. The NPRM addresses issues related to the participation of foreign schools in the Title IV student aid programs.

It is expected that this NPRM will be published early in the week of July 19, 2010. However, a draft copy is available now on the Department of Education's Office of Postsecondary Education Web site at the following address:

Sallie Mae Begins Servicing Direct Loans (07/15/10)

In a June 23, 2010 Electronic Announcement posted on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site, we informed the community that we were ready to begin assigning William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) Program Direct loans to the new federal loan servicers, and began doing so with Nelnet on June 23, 2010.

At this time, we are pleased to announce that we began assigning Direct Loans to Sallie Mae on July 14, 2010. This means that the Direct Loan Servicing Center (ACS), Nelnet, FedLoan Servicing (PHEAA), Great Lakes Educational Loan Services, Inc., and Sallie Mae are the five federal loan servicers to which we currently will assign new Direct Loans.

Master Promissory Note, Entrance Counseling, and PLUS Search Issues [(4/22/10) Updated 7/13/10]

Federal Student Aid has identified several issues when schools search for Direct Loan Master Promissory Notes (MPNs), Direct Loan Entrance Counseling results, or Direct PLUS Loan Requests via the COD Web site.

Issue 1: MPN Search by SSN-The search results do not return all MPNs associated with the student.

The search results should include any MPNs from any school associated with a student. Federal Student Aid has determined that in some cases, a search by student SSN is not pulling all MPNs



associated with that student. For example, the search results will not always include a Direct PLUS Loan MPN associated with that student. In other cases, no search results are returned at all, even if an MPN is on file.

Issue 2: MPN Search by Date Range-The search results of more than 100 records do not display correctly and school cannot move to "Page 2" of the results.

The search results should include all MPNs within the date range. Federal Student Aid has determined that a date range search will only display the first 100 records and the school receives an error message when it attempts to view results on "Page 2".

RESOLVED-Issue 3: Direct Loan Entrance Counseling date range search is unavailable.

The date range search functionality for Direct Loan Entrance Counseling is now available. In order to return the best results when performing a date range search, the maximum search period is 7 days.

Issue 4: Direct PLUS Loan Request (PLUS Acknowledgement) date range search is unavailable.

Federal Student Aid has determined that the date range search functionality for Direct PLUS Loan Requests is not working correctly. As a result, the functionality has been disabled temporarily. *Note:* In order to further research this issue, on May 13, 2010, Federal Student Aid disabled the date range search on the PLUS Application Response Request Search page (under the Batch Search menu).

Issue 5: Person Search by SSN-No search results returned, but batch search by SSN does return results

The search results should return information related to the person (student/borrower). Federal Student Aid has determined that in some cases, a person search by SSN does not return search results with the person, even if the person is on file. However, when completing a batch search by SSN, search results are returned.

Federal Student Aid is continuing its work to resolve the remaining search issues as soon as possible and will provide updates as more information becomes available. These updates will be posted in the COD Processing Update.

As an alternative, schools can use the Batch Search page to locate the desired information. When using this workaround, a school should perform a general date range search (up to 60 days) for ALL batches. After the results are displayed, the school can filter the results for the specific batch type: "EC" for Entrance Counseling batches, "PN" for MPN batches, and "SP" for PLUS Request Acknowledgement batches.

Reminder of Origination Fee Reduction for Direct Subsidized Loans and Direct Unsubsidized Loans (05/14/10)

As explained in a February 4, 2010 Electronic Announcement posted on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site, the origination fee for Direct Subsidized Loans and Direct Unsubsidized Loans was reduced for 2010-2011. This announcement provides operational guidance for schools and third party software providers on implementing these latest reductions in the origination fee.

Last year, many Direct Subsidized Loan and Direct Unsubsidized Loan awards rejected because the correct origination fee was not included with the award and/or was not used to calculate the award and its disbursements. For this reason, we want to remind schools of the previously provided guidance that is critical to successfully implementing the origination fee reduction for Direct Subsidized Loan and Direct Unsubsidized Loan awards.

Schools should refer to the February 4, 2010 Electronic Announcement for complete information about the origination fee reduction.

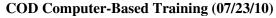
