NEWS/UPDATES

- **Impact on COD Processing August 23, 2015 (8/21/15)**

Federal Student Aid is planning several system maintenance activities on August 23, 2015. In addition, the Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) will be unavailable from 3:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M. (ET) due to its regular Sunday morning maintenance. These activities will result in outages of certain COD System functionality for a period of time.

Extended COD System Maintenance

From 1:00 A.M. (ET) until 12:00 noon (ET) on Sunday, August 23, 2015—

- Users will not be able to submit or retrieve data via the [COD Web site](#).
- Users will not be able to access the COD Reports area of the [COD Web site](#).
- An individual will not be able to complete any actions or view loan correspondence via the [StudentLoans.gov Web site](#).
- An individual will not be able to complete any actions via the [TEACH Grant Web site](#).
- Batches submitted by schools via the SAIG will be held or schools will receive an error message informing them that the SAIG is unavailable and that the data must be transmitted at a later time.

- **2014-2015 Reconciliation Reports Sent to Reporting Schools (8/17/15)**

To assist schools with final reporting before the September 30, 2015 deadline, **beginning August 14, 2015**, the **2014-2015 Pell Grant Reconciliation Report** was sent to the Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) mailboxes of all reporting schools with at least one funded 2014-2015 Pell Grant disbursement.

Schools will receive the 2014-2015 Reconciliation Report on or shortly after August 14, 2015.

Key information about the 2014-2015 Reconciliation Report is as follows:

- The report includes information for all Pell Grant recipients, at all attended campuses for the reporting school.
- The report is in the standard fixed-length format as specified in Volume VI, Section 8 of the [2014-2015 COD Technical Reference](#).



- Each report is sent to the reporting school's SAIG mailbox via the appropriate program/award year message class.

Note: While we have automatically sent the 2014-2015 Reconciliation Report to schools as specified above, a school can request a Pell Grant Reconciliation Report via the [COD Web site](#) or by submitting the batch data request for the appropriate program/award year message class via the SAIG. To request a report via the COD Web site, select the New Report Request link located under the Batch tab followed by the Report Requests link on the left.

- **Title IV Refund Issue in G5 (7/31/15)**

The Department of Education (the Department) is working to resolve a G5 system issue in which some users may receive an error stating "action failed: Pay.Gov is not available" when processing a refund. If you receive this error, contact the G5 Hotline at 888/336-8930 to confirm whether or not the refund was submitted successfully **before** any attempt at reprocessing the refund. Attempting to reprocess the refund after receiving this error may result in a duplicate refund. **Note:** The G5 Hotline will provide confirmation of the refund within 1-3 business days; it will not be an immediate response.

The Department expects to resolve this issue with the next G5 system update planned for the middle of November. If you have additional questions about this issue or about G5, contact the G5 Hotline. You may also e-mail edcaps.user@ed.gov.

- **TEACH Grant Closeout Information for 2014-2015 Award Year (6/8/15)**

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant, closeout deadline for the 2014-2015 Award Year is Wednesday, September 30, 2015. This is the last processing day of the award year. All school data must be received and accepted by this date to be included in a school's final Ending Cash Balance for the year.

To be considered successfully closed out, the school must—

- Reconcile to an Ending Cash Balance (Net Drawdowns – Total Net Booked Disbursements) of \$0 and Total Net Unbooked Disbursements of \$0, as reflected on your monthly TEACH Grant School Account Statement (SAS) Report and in your school's internal records.

Keep School Contact Information Current in the COD System (8/21/15)

We remind schools and third party servicers that contact information in the COD System must be kept current. Contact information is extremely important for us to be able to reach the right people at the school, particularly about program-specific issues. The e-mail addresses for the President, Financial Aid Administrator, Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer, and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer are used to deliver time-sensitive materials and critical COD processing information to the school.

Having current contact information for the Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer is most critical for a school that is an additional location to a main campus. The information allows us to contact those officers directly at the additional location rather than needing to contact the main campus.
