- **COD Common Record XML Schema Version 4.0a Now Available (10/30/13)**

In Spring 2014, Federal Student Aid plans to implement Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) System functionality that will support the processing of Federal Pell Grant (Pell Grant), Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant, Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant, and William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) awards for the 2014-2015 Award Year. In conjunction with this implementation, Federal Student Aid will begin using a new version of the COD Common Record Extensible Markup Language (XML) Schema. The new schema version is 4.0a.

- **150% Direct Subsidized Loan Limit - Tracking Teacher Certification Programs for the 2013-2014 Direct Loan Processing Year (10/28/13)**

On October 25, 2013, Federal Student Aid posted an [Electronic Announcement](#) advising schools that offer certain types of teacher certification programs of a special reporting process that will be required for first-time borrowers enrolled in such programs during the 2013-2014 Direct Loan Processing Year.

- **Operational Updates and COD System Readiness for Direct Loan Origination Fee Percent Increases (10/28/13)**

As explained in [Dear Colleague Letter \(DCL\) GEN-13-22](#) posted on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site, the origination fee for Direct Subsidized Loans, Direct Unsubsidized Loans, and Direct PLUS Loans (for both parent and graduate student borrowers) will increase as of December 1, 2013. - **COD Computer-Based Training (10/25/13)**

DIRECT LOANS

RESOLVED - Some MPN System-Generated Responses Delayed (10/30/13)

Federal Student Aid has corrected an intermittent issue that prevented some Master Promissory Note system-generated responses (PN response type) from being sent to schools for the period October 23-25, 2013. The issue is resolved and the impacted PN responses will be sent to schools within the next few days.

Federal Student Aid apologizes for the inconvenience this issue may have caused.

Having current contact information for the Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer is most critical for a school that is an additional location to a main campus. The information allows us to contact those officers directly at the additional location rather than needing to contact the main campus.

REMINDERS

Keep School Contact Information Current in the COD System (11/1/13)

We remind schools and third party servicers that contact information in the COD System must be kept current. Contact information is extremely important for us to be able to reach the right people at the school, particularly about program-specific issues. The e-mail addresses for the President, Financial Aid Administrator, Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer, and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer are used to deliver time-sensitive materials and critical COD processing information to the school.
