Additional System Functionality For 2011-2012 Award Year Implemented (10/28/11)

Federal Student Aid is pleased to announce the implementation of additional COD System functionality during the period October 21-22, 2011. These system changes support 2011-2012 Award Year processing. Federal Student Aid implemented all of the system changes described in an October 14, 2011 Electronic Announcement on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site (http://ifap.ed.gov/eannouncements/101411AdditionalCODSystemImplem1112AY.html).

RESOLVED - COD Web site Returning Errors When Updating Person Information [(07/11/11) Updated 10/27/11]

In July 2011, Federal Student Aid identified an issue when schools attempted to update person information via the COD Web site. Specifically, when a user was updating person information, the Award list defaulted to an award from a "closed" Award Year.

Federal Student Aid has implemented a fix for this issue. When updating person information, the Award list now defaults to the most recent award on file for the person.

DIRECT LOANS

Incorrect Servicer Information in September 2011 Direct Loan SAS (10/05/11)

Federal Student Aid has identified an issue with the federal loan servicer information provided in the September 2011 Direct Loan School Account Statement (SAS). This SAS included data through September 30,

2011 and was available in Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) mailboxes on October 3, 2011.

The financial transactions in the September 2011 Direct Loan SAS are correct; however, the servicer information is incorrect and should not be used by schools. The issue affects the September 2011 Direct Loan SAS for all open award years.

Federal Student Aid plans to correct the federal loan servicer information in the October 2011 Direct Loan SAS. In the meantime, schools can log in to the COD Web site and select the Servicer search from the Person menu to identify the servicer for a particular award. Schools can also select the Borrower-Servicer Relationship search from the View Person Information screen.

GRANTS

RESOLVED - Pell Grant Awards Rejecting Incorrectly for Edit 38 When Last Name Change Involved [(9/8/2011) Updated 10/28/11]

In September 2011, Federal Student Aid discovered an issue when a school submitted a Pell Grant award and the student's "original" and "current" last name field tags did not match. The COD System incorrectly tried to

link the CPS transaction using the original last name instead of the current last name. The school then received COD Reject Edit 38 (Student not Pell eligible) incorrectly because the last name on the CPS transaction and the Pell Grant award record did not match.

Federal Student Aid has implemented a fix for this issue.

REMINDERS

Reminder - Active Confirmation of TG Numbers (SAIG Mailboxes) Required by December 16, 2011 to Maintain Access to Federal Student Aid Systems (11/04/2011)

As a reminder, every organization enrolled for a Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) account is required to review and validate its assigned TG numbers by **December 16, 2011.** Complete information about this requirement is in an electronic announcement posted to the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site on October 12, 2011.

Extended COD System Maintenance

From 12:30 A.M. (ET) until 11:00 A.M. (ET) on Sunday, November 6, 2011—

- Users will not be able to submit or retrieve data via the COD Web site.
- An individual will not be able to complete online Direct Loan Entrance Counseling, complete a new Master Promissory Note (MPN) electronically, complete a Direct PLUS Loan Request electronically, endorse a Direct PLUS Loan electronically or view loan correspondence via the StudentLoans.gov Web site.
- An individual will not be able to complete TEACH Grant Initial and Subsequent Counseling, complete a new TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS), or retrieve an existing ATS via the TEACH Grant Web site.
- Batches submitted by schools via the SAIG will be held or schools will receive an error message informing them that the SAIG is unavailable and that the data must be transmitted at a later time.

COD Computer-Based Training (11/04/11)

Federal Student Aid takes this opportunity to remind the community of the availability of the COD Computer-Based Training (CBT).

Sending Addresses for U.S. Territories and Foreign Countries on the Common Record or the COD Web site (11/04/11)

When submitting student or borrower addresses or address changes to the Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) System, it is important that the correct tags are used, particularly when the student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory or Foreign Country. If these addresses are not submitted correctly, important correspondence from the COD System and the federal loan servicers is delayed or not received.

- When a student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory it is considered a domestic address. Do not submit a Country Code.
- When a student or borrower address is located in a Foreign Country, it is treated as a foreign address.

See below for the correct procedures for submitting U.S. Territories and Foreign Country addresses via the Common Record batch submission or COD Web site.



Submitting Addresses for U.S. Territories and Foreign Countries via the Common Record

When creating or updating a person record via the Common Record batch submission, a school should send the address block with the following tags:

Submitting Addresses for U.S. Territories and Foreign Countries via the COD Web site

When creating or updating a person record on the COD Web site, a school should select the U.S. Territory from the dropdown box in the State/Province field. A school should select the Country field as "Blank".

A complete list of State Codes (including U.S. Territories), Jurisdictions, and Country Codes are provided in Volume VI, Section 4 of the 2010-2011 COD Technical Reference. If you have questions about this information, contact the COD School Relations Center.
