NEWS/UPDATES

- **Impact on COD Processing November 13-15, 2015 (11/10/15)**

Federal Student Aid is planning several system maintenance activities during the period of November 13-15, 2015. In addition, the Student Aid Internet Gateway (SAIG) will be unavailable from 3:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M. (ET) due to its regular Sunday morning maintenance. These activities will result in outages of certain COD System functionality for a period of time.

An explanation of how these activities will impact COD System availability and processing follows below. Please review this information to determine if processing at your school will be affected.

Extended COD System Maintenance

From 5:00 P.M. (ET) on Friday, November 13, 2015 until 12:00 A.M. (ET) on Sunday, November 15, 2015—

- An individual will not be able to complete any actions or view loan correspondence via the [StudentLoans.gov Web site](#).

From 12:00 P.M. (ET) on Saturday, November 14, 2015 until 12:00 A.M. (ET) on Sunday, November 15, 2015—

- Users will not be able to submit or retrieve data via the [COD Web site](#).
- Users will not be able to access the COD Reports area of the [COD Web site](#).
- Batches submitted by schools via the SAIG will be held or schools will receive an error message informing them that the SAIG is unavailable and that the data must be transmitted at a later time.

- **Paper MPN and Endorser Addendum Processing Delay November 14-30, 2015**

To perform technology upgrades, Federal Student Aid will delay COD System processing of paper Master Promissory Notes (MPNs) and Endorser Addenda during the period November 14-30, 2015. As a result, any paper MPNs and Endorser Addenda received during this time will not be viewable on the COD Web site and will not be available for linking to applicable Direct Loan awards until after November 30, 2015.

There will not be any delays in processing MPNs and Endorser Addenda completed electronically via the StudentLoans.gov Web site.

- **REMINDER - Direct Loan Origination Fees Change October 1, 2015 (8/27/15)**

As a reminder, the origination fees for Direct Subsidized Loans, Direct Unsubsidized Loans, and Direct PLUS Loans (for both parent and graduate student borrowers) change as of October 1, 2015 (see [Dear Colleague Letter GEN-15-07](#)). Additional operational guidance is provided in an [August 26, 2015 Electronic Announcement](#).

Schools should review these communications and review their systems and Direct Loan records to ensure the correct origination fee is being used.

- **Title IV Refund Issue in G5 (7/31/15)**

The Department of Education (the Department) is working to resolve a G5 system issue in which some users may receive an error stating "action failed: Pay.Gov is not available" when processing a refund. If you receive this error, contact the G5 Hotline at 888/336-8930 to confirm whether or not the refund was submitted successfully *before* any attempt at reprocessing the refund. Attempting to reprocess the refund after receiving this error may result in a duplicate refund. **Note:** The G5 Hotline will provide confirmation of the refund within 1-3 business days; it will not be an immediate response.

Keep School Contact Information Current in the COD System (11/13/15)

We remind schools and third party servicers that contact information in the COD System must be kept current. Contact information is extremely important for us to be able to reach the right people at the school, particularly about program-specific issues. The e-mail addresses for the President, Financial Aid Administrator, Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer, and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer are used to deliver time-sensitive materials and critical COD processing information to the school.

Having current contact information for the Pell Grant Financial Aid Officer and Direct Loan Financial Aid Officer is most critical for a school that is an additional location to a main campus. The information allows us to contact those officers directly at the additional location rather than needing to contact the main campus.
