## CURRENT ISSUES

### DIRECT LOANS

#### **Direct PLUS Loan Responses Issue (11/16/11)**

Federal Student Aid has identified an issue in which Direct PLUS Loan Request Acknowledgements (Message Class: CRSP) are not being generated in certain situations. Specifically, the CRSP files are not being sent when a borrower submits a Direct PLUS Loan Request via the [StudentLoans.gov Web site](#) **and** there is no corresponding Direct PLUS Loan award on the COD System, **and** one of the following is true:

- A pending credit decision is resolved and processed.
- An appeal to an adverse credit decision is received and approved.

Federal Student Aid is currently researching the cause of this issue and is working to fix this issue as soon as possible. In the meantime, a school can contact the COD School Relations Center to receive an updated CRSP file.

### **OUTAGE ALERT - Federal Student Aid Web Site and System Outages Scheduled for December 18, 2011 (12/13/11)**

On December 18, 2011, Federal Student Aid plans to implement annual system updates to the [Student Aid Internet Gateway \(SAIG\) Enrollment Web site](#). The updates will add the 2012-2013 Award Year to the appropriate services. In addition, users currently enrolled for 2011-2012 batch services or FAA Access to CPS Online services will be automatically enrolled for those services for the 2012-2013 cycle.

This work is being completed in conjunction with other annual system updates and routine maintenance planned for Sunday, December 18, 2011. As a result, several other Web sites will also be unavailable.

In a [December 9, 2011 Electronic Announcement](#) posted on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site, Federal Student Aid provides information about the Web sites that will be affected during the extended maintenance period. ### **REMINDER - New Street Address for Mailing Paper Master Promissory Notes and Endorser Addenda Effective December 19, 2011 (12/16/11)**

An [Electronic Announcement](#) was released to schools from the COD School Relations Center today and is posted on the Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) Web site. As previously noted in a [November 15, 2011 Electronic Announcement posted on the IFAP Web site](#), this announcement is a reminder to schools that the street address for sending paper Master Promissory Notes (MPNs) and Endorser Addenda to the Department of Education via express or overnight delivery changes Monday, December 19, 2011.

### **COD Holiday Schedule For December 26 and January 2, 2012 (12/13/11)**

Because the Christmas Day holiday and New Year's Day holiday fall on Sundays, the COD School Relations Center will be closed on Monday, December 26, 2011 (the day after Christmas) to observe the Christmas Day holiday, as well as on Monday, January 2, 2012 (the day after New Year's Day) to observe the New Year's Day holiday. In both cases, the COD School Relations Center will reopen at 8:00 A.M. (ET) on the next business day –

Tuesday, December 27, 2011 and Tuesday, January 3, 2012, respectively.

The COD System will accept and process data from schools and send back responses/acknowledgments on Monday, December 26, 2011, as well as Monday, January 2, 2012, but schools will not be able to receive any federal funds on those days. Requests for changes in funding levels and for funds will not be processed until Tuesday, December 27, 2011 (for requests received on the 26<sup>th</sup>) and Tuesday, January 3, 2012 (for requests received on the 2<sup>nd</sup>).

### **COD Computer-Based Training (12/16/11)**

Federal Student Aid takes this opportunity to remind the community of the availability of the COD Computer-Based Training (CBT).

The COD CBT consists of component simulations and CBTs. ### **Sending Addresses for U.S. Territories and Foreign Countries on the Common Record or the COD Web site (12/16/11)**

When submitting student or borrower addresses or address changes to the Common Origination and Disbursement (COD) System, it is important that the correct tags are used, particularly when the student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory or Foreign Country. If these addresses are not submitted correctly, important correspondence from the COD System and the federal loan servicers is delayed or not received.



- When a student or borrower address is located in a U.S. Territory it is considered a domestic address. Do not submit a Country Code.
- When a student or borrower address is located in a Foreign Country, it is treated as a foreign address.

See below for the correct procedures for submitting U.S. Territories and Foreign Country addresses via the Common Record batch submission or COD Web site.

### Submitting Addresses for U.S. Territories and Foreign Countries via the Common Record

When creating or updating a person record via the Common Record batch submission, a school should send the address block with the following tags:
