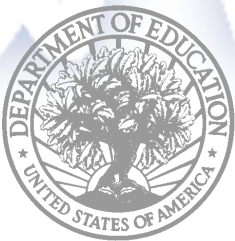

The Student Financial Assistance Programs have the Single Identifier Initiative (SII) Web site to give institutions individualized information about the D-U-N-S identification system which will replace all other program and EDE identifiers by the 2001-2002 application and award year.
