## ***1999-2000 Delivery System Dates***

# ***Delivery System Changes***

- **Biggest changes were to FAFSA and**
- **Option to receive ISIRs on magnetic tape or cartridge discontinued**
- **System-generated transactions sent in separate message class**
- **Duplicate SSN and Return Mail Rosters**
- **In Spring 1999, ISIRs transmitted over Internet instead of TIV WAN**



## ***New Automated Voice Response System for Students***

- **PIC now offers Automated Voice Response System for students to:**
  - **Check status of their applications**
  - **Order duplicate SARs**
- **Call 1-800-4-FED-AID**



## ***Changes to CPS Voice Processing System***

- **Streamlined for easier access to most frequently used options**
- **Added option for FISAP for Windows**
- **Removed option to transfer to other Title IV contractors**
- **Added option to request EDExpress Packaging setup worksheets**



## ***1999-2000 FAFSA***

- **Instructions for ordering FAFSAs -  
Announcement on IFAP (ANN-98-13)**
  - **Schools can order FAFSAs over the web:  
<http://epos.edpubs.org>**
- **Began distributing FAFSAs in early**







# ***Delivery System Changes***

- **Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)  
(implement at start-up)**
- **To confirm student's claim to be**
- **Veteran Status Confirmed**
  - Not a Qualifying Veteran - assume not a**
  - Not Found on Database - assume not a Veteran**
  - On Active Duty**



## ***Delivery System Changes SSA Matches***

- **Two new matches with SSA - both implemented after start-up**
- **Expand current match to include Date of**
  - **If match occurs, applicant record rejected**
  - **Student must resolve all errors with SSA**
- **New match with Prisoner's File maintained**
  - **Record not rejected; "C" Code and comment**



## ***Delivery System Changes Edits***

- **Reject Codes 2 and 3 combined into single Reject Code 2 (not enough income**
- **Renewal applicants no longer subjected to Reject Code N when first or last name**



## ***1999-2000 FAFSA***

- **Major redesign of form**
- **ED worked in cooperation with applicants and financial aid community to develop kinder, simpler form**
- **Redesigned FAFSA approved by OMB on**

- If you are filing a **1998 income tax return**, we recommend that you fill it out before completing this form. However, you do not need to send your income tax return to the IRS before you fill out this form.
- After you complete this application, make a copy of it. Then send the original of pages 3 through 6 in the attached envelope or send it to Federal Student Aid Programs, P.O. Box 4008, Mt. Vernon, IL 62864-8608.
- Send in this application—pages 3 through 6—only between **January 1, 1999, and June 30, 2000.**
- You should hear from us within four weeks. If you do not, please call 1-319-337-5665.
- If you or your family has **unusual circumstances** (such as loss of employment or major medical expenses) that might affect your need for student financial aid, check with the financial aid office at the college you plan to attend.
- With this form you may also be able to apply for student aid from other sources, such as your state or college. The deadlines for states (see below) or colleges may be as early as January 1999, and you may be required to complete additional forms.

**Deadline dates for state aid.** Generally, state aid comes from your state of legal residence. Check with your high school guidance counselor or the financial aid administrator at your college about state and college sources of student financial aid. State deadlines are below.

## *Redesigned for 1999-2000*

- Reduced from 16 to 8 pages
- Reorganized into Steps One through Six
- Order of questions revised; more closely matches FAFSA on the Web
- 2 colors: yellow for students and purple for
- Eliminated SNT decision trees (formerly Worksheets A & B)
- State deadlines moved to front page
- ED's Toll-Free number moved to front page



## ***1999-2000 FAFSA Data Element Changes***

- **Total number of questions reduced from**
- **Unearned income items moved to Worksheet A**
- **Earned Income Credit (EIC) is a separate**
- **Hope Scholarship and Lifetime Learning Tax Credit information collected on**



## ***1999-2000 FAFSA Data Element Changes, cont'd***

- **Assets reported as “net worth”**
- **“Title IV School Code” renamed “Federal**
- **Spouse’s signature no longer collected on**
- **Only one space for parent signature  
provided on FAFSA**





## ***1999-2000 Renewal FAFSA***

- **Relatively few changes made to format**
- **Questions reworded and reordered to correspond to FAFSA changes**
- **Instructions reduced from 24 to 12**
- **Renewal FAFSA and Instructions on**



## ***1999-2000 Renewal Application Process***

- **Action Letter #1, GEN-98-19, posted on IFAP in September 1998**
- **Important dates:**
  - **Oct 5 - Nov 6: Schools request Renewal**
  - **Nov 12 - 20 - CPS printed and bulk-mailed Renewal FAFSAs**



# ***1999-2000 Renewal Application Process***

- **Important Dates, cont'd:**
  - Nov 23 - Jan 8 - CPS prints and mails Renewal FAFSAs not requested by
  - Nov 28 - Students begin requesting
- **Second mailing of Renewal FAFSAs**



# ***Application Volume***

- **Volume:**

- **1997-98 FAFSAs: 8,897,852 as of**

- **1998-99 FAFSAs: 8,921,495 as of**

- **0.2 % increase in volume from  
1997-98 to 1998-99**

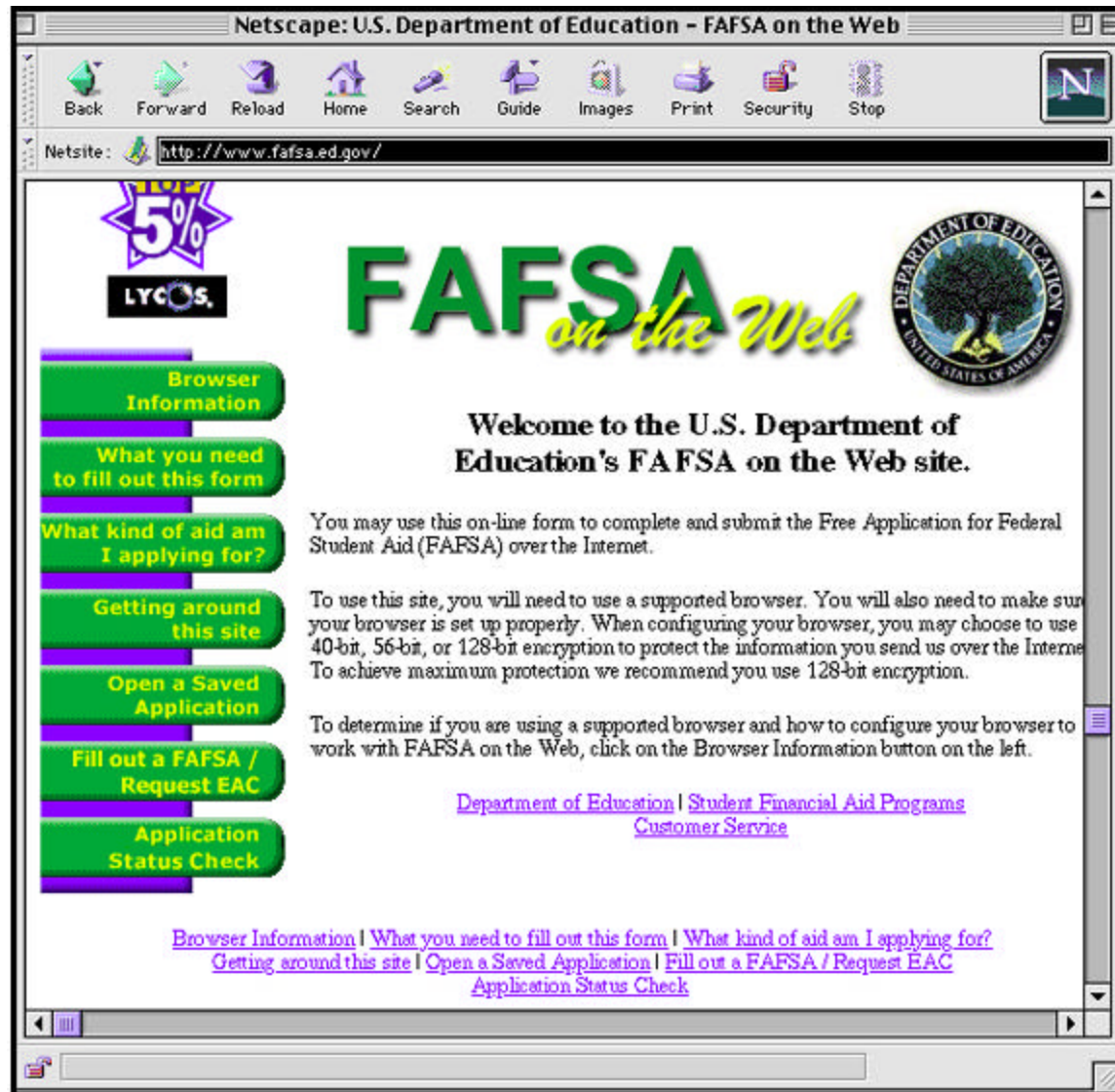


## ***FAFSA on the Web and Renewal FAFSA on the Web***

- Available to students on Jan. 4, 1999
- Expanded browser options: 40-, 56-, and 128-bit encryption
- Questions changed to match FAFSA
- Added assumption and reject overrides
- New on-line application status checking
  
- New EFC Estimator (coming soon!)
- New Banner Ad (coming soon!)



# FAFSA on the WEB





## ***FAFSA on the Web***

- **Interview format retained**
- **Signature process the same**
- **To promote FAFSA on the Web, ED will distribute brochures to high schools, postsecondary schools, state agencies, libraries, PTAs, and**



## ***FAFSA on the Web Advantages***

- **No software to install**
- **Can be used on PC or Macintosh platform**
- **Contains skip logic**
- **Built-in edits reduce reject rate (<0.5%)**
- **Data is entered by student**
- **Faster processing time**





## ***Renewal FAFSA on the Web***

- **More than 70,000 processed for 1998-99 (through December 6)**
- **Students will receive instruction booklet with Renewal FAFSA encouraging use of Renewal**
- **Students will need an EAC to access Renewal**
- **EACs will be same as last year**
- **Students began requesting EACs**
- **Student must reside at address in CPS**



## ***Electronic Access Codes Changes***

- **EACs automatically sent to students who filed:**
  - **1998-99 FAFSA on the Web or Renewal FAFSA**
  - **1998-99 paper or electronic FAFSA and:**
    - **5th year U/G or Grad AND**
    - **expected to complete program after 7/99**
- **Will not receive paper Renewal Application**
- **Mailing of EACs began on 11/30**
- **EACs mailed during bulk-mailing period will be**



## ***Renewal FAFSA on the Web - Using the EAC***

- **EAC serves as student's signature**
- **Dependent students will have to print and mail signature page with parent signature**
- **Students will be able to use EAC to gain access to other financial aid systems (upcoming pilot with Direct Loan Servicer)**



## ***Renewal FAFSA on the Web - Advantages***

- **Advantages similar to FAFSA on the**
  - **Very fast processing for independent students because EAC serves as**
  - **Very little data for students to enter**



## ***FAFSA Express***

- **Includes same assumptions and reject overrides added to web products**
- **Available for students to download from the Web by time system starts**

## ***EDExpress*** ***Changes for 1999-2000***

- **Early Analysis is a correctable field**
- **Includes same new assumptions and reject overrides added to web products and FAFSA Express**
- **32-bit conversion; need to use Windows 95, 98, or NT**
- **Student entry option will not be available in 1999-2000 software**



## ***SAR and ISIR Changes***

- **SAR is yellow**
- **Instructions and Codes page simplified**
- **Order and numbering of questions revised to correspond to FAFSA changes**
- **Data Release Number (DRN) printed on front of every page of SAR**
- **Draft 1999-2000 SAR, SAR Acknowledgement, and SAR Instructions**



# ***SAR and ISIR***

## ***Changes to NSLDS History Page***

- **Aggregate Amount for FFELP/Direct**
  - Section reorganized
  - “Unsubsidized Loans” field renamed
  
- **Pell Grant Data Section:**
  - Added space for third record of payment
  
  - Added EFC and Verification Tracking Flag





## ***Changes to NSLDS History Page, Cont'd***

- **Loan Detail Section:**
  - Added new grade level field
- **Two new SAR/ISIR comments for FFEL**
  - Student is within one annual loan limit of aggregate loan maximum
  - Student appears to have borrowed in excess of aggregate loan limit
    - SAR/ISIR will have SAR “C” Code
